It is time to take a look at the HLCA's past year and to look forward to getting back to the lake and outdoor activities with friends and family.

The summer of 2022 started May Long weekend with the return of the HLCA General meeting being held in person at the Hall. YAY! It was on this day that we got to thank Brad and Maria Willing for their years of commitment to the Haliburton Lake Community and welcome John and Michelle Mihalic as the new owners of Fort Irwin Marina. Other guests included Mayor Andrea Roberts, and Councillor Walt McKechnie whom brought those members in attendance up to speed on such municipality topics as the shoreline bylaw, short term rental licensing, cell tower service and the septic maintenance program. A new lake quality testing program was introduced by Lindsay Bevan. This program is being initiated by ten Haliburton Lakes in partnership with U-Links. The goal of the program is to establish a standard for water quality testing protocols, to share and compare trends across lakes. This program got started in 2022 with testing being completed in July and September. Thank you to Lindsay Bevan, Paul Carey, Dave Bright, Lloyd Dunham and Andy Valikas for their contributions to this program. The results are posted to the HLCA website.

The 2022 HLCA Board consisted of Brent McLean (President), Serena Bradbury (Secretary), Brady Siersma (Treasurer) whom finish their two year term this May. The Directors of the HLCA agreeing to remain on the board in 2022, Nick Mezzapelli (Web Master), Kathleen Boss (Communications), Candice Bradbury-Endicott (Membership), Larry Marion, Jay Kea and Connor Blackwell. Without these people, programming, information and representation provided to the membership would not be possible. We will be looking for some new/additional directors to help fill some roles on the 2023 Board. In particular the HLCA Board will be looking for a new Treasurer to fill Brady's role as he is stepping down from the position. The AGM is currently scheduled for Saturday May 20th.

Lake Navigation and Lake Health continue to be important mandates for the HLCA. During the summer of 2022, Bob Bevan updated all of the Red/Green lake markers to a new 6" marker and the green changed to a very visible Jungle Green. The old markers have been refurbished and painted yellow for use during other HLCA events. The board is extremely grateful for the effort that Bob puts into navigation each year. September saw U-Links complete bio metrics testing for lake quality arranged by Lindsay Bevan. May saw the introduction of new Haliburton Lake Cottage Association Swag, with a new design. We are seeing lots of the Cottage wear around the lake. Thank you to Christine Marion and Carrie McLean for taking the lead in organizing the new swag.

July long weekend started off with Christmas in July, organized by Serena Bradbury and her team of volunteers. This is a great kick off to the summer as the event gets all the kids reacquainted with their summer time friends over some snow cones, cookies, crafts and pictures with Santa. Later that evening, for the first time in a couple of years we had Canada Day Fireworks on the proper weekend and we did not have to fight the weather. The Fireworks Team actually had to wait for the beautiful night sky to get dark enough for the show to start. 1. Head and Assistant Swim Instructor

Qualifications required, at a minimum, are a current Instructors Certificate through the Lifesaving Society and a National Lifeguard Society Certificate. Applicants should be energetic, creative and passionate about children. The ideal Head position candidate will be a great leader, work well as a team and require minimal supervision. The ideal Assistant position candidate needs to be dependable, take direction well and possess a willingness to learn. The salary range for these positions start at \$15 to \$20 per hour depending on qualifications and experience.

2. Swim Program Assistant

We are looking for teen cottagers, with an interest in a future Swim Instructor position, wanting to help our swimming program run smoothly. Interested applicants should be a min. of 13 years old, have a Bronze Medallion certification or higher, have experience with children, and are willing to take initiative and direction. There will be an honorarium offered of \$50.00 per week or we can confirm participation for high school volunteer hour requirements.

*A minimum two week commitment is required.

Responsibilities may include:

- Helping to set up for lessons in the am (i.e., putting out signage, getting equipment set out)
- Cleaning up and maintaining the beach and adjoining park area (i.e., removing geese feces, raking)
- Assisting during the lessons in the water (i.e., helping to engage younger swimmers in games)
- Instructors may also delegate other tasks as needed
