PRESIDENT'S REPORT

CUSTODIAN AND SNOW REMOVAL REPORT

Again this year snow was very heavy and 215 cottages took Custodian Services.

Because of this heavy snow, all cottages had snow removed twice and the majority three times. No damages were reported to cottages covered by our services.

We again recommend that this service be provided next winter. It consists of a periodic patrol around each cottage starting by December 1st, and removal of excess snow when necessary until April 1st.

In providing the Custodian and Snow Removal Service the Association does not accept any responsibility for damage to cottages resulting from any cause whatsoever.

To assist in removal of snow, we suggest and urge each member to leave a ladder in position against the cottage, or where it can be easily reached.

Each cottage should have their lot number clearly visible on the cottage or on the property somewhere, to eliminate the possibility of mistakes.

ROADS COMMITTEE REPORT

These markers will have a light reflecting substance on them for night driving.

Permission is being requested from Council to erect signs governing the speed on the Lake roads to a speed which is considered safe since some motorists insist on driving at an excessive rate, endangering the lives of other motorists and pedestrians.

Due to the untidy practise of some who use the garbage dump located at South Bay, it has now become necessary to erect signs prohibiting the dumping of garbage around the entrance to the dump, and we are also attempting to have a new dump opened which will be located around West Bay and will benefit the cottagers around the North end of the Lake.

FUTURE PROGRAM:

We are working on a larviciding program for next spring, that is early April. All stagnant and infesting areas will first be located on a map of the Lake. We hope to have a representative from each plan, as a working committee. In this way we should be able to cover all areas.

Owning our own small, portable fogging equipment is also being investigated.

Another season is beginning, mosquitoes will be here, but there is finally some hope in sight.

WATER SAFETY REPORT

The Water Safety Committee has been able to procure a Declaration from the Department of Works, Ottawa, for the installation of marker buoys that are in use at the present time, and for the installation of four additional markers to be placed as follows:

1. Two at the entrance to the channel at South Bay.
2. One off the South-west point of the large island.
3. One at the North end of the island.

All these markers to be installed with flasher lights. The installation of these markers will take place in the fall of 1960.

It has been planned this year to attach a large scale ruler to a column of the bridge at the Centre, from this, we may take periodic readings of the fall and rise of water levels.

A film and talk will be given on Water Safety by a member of the R.C.M.P. on July 16th, 1960. We are hoping that all boat owners and water-safety-conscious persons will attend and take advantage of this worth-while information.

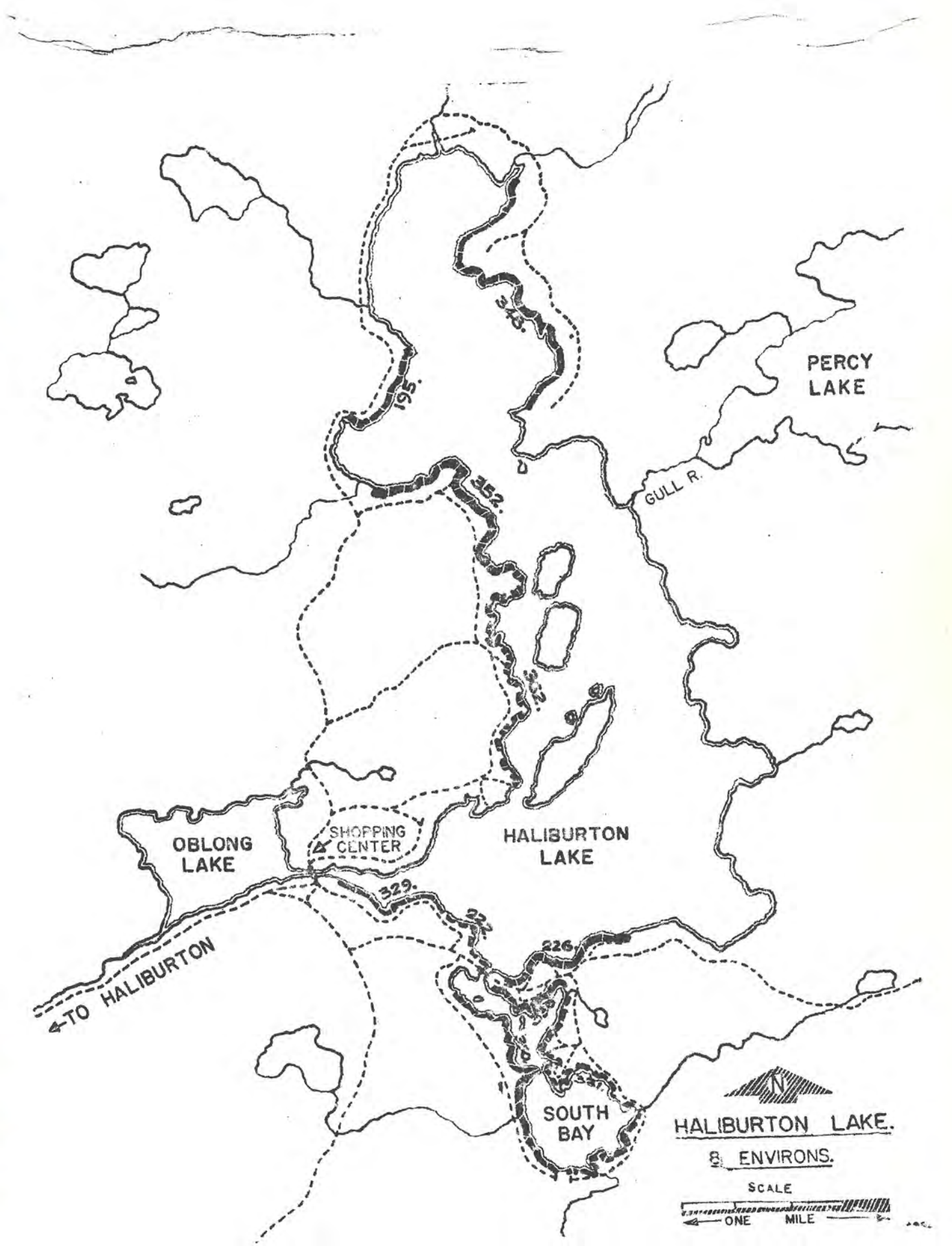
Due to the enthusiasm and attendance of swimming instruction classes held last year, we have made arrangements with the Canadian Red Cross Society to hold supervised swimming instruction three days a week during July and August. It is also necessary to construct a floating dock and catwalk. This dock is quite important to the instructor and student.

I understand that the Ski Club President (Bill Harvey Jr.) and his executive have made great progress and plans for this coming year. I would strongly recommend that those persons interested in becoming a member contact Bill Harvey Jr.

I would like at this time to mention a condition that is prevailing from year to year, that is water level. A problem that is important to every boat owner and cottager on our Lake. Last fall several directors met with engineers from the Department of Works, at Haliburton Lake. From this meeting and survey of our condition, the engineers sent a report to the Department of Transport, suggesting dredging be done or leaving more logs in the dam at Oblong Lake in order to maintain a safe water level on Haliburton Lake. The latest information we have is that no dredging will be done as it is only a benefit to those on the Lake. We are now hoping for the alternate suggestion of water level by control at the dam on Oblong Lake, until after the holiday season.

In closing, I would like to make an appeal to all boat enthusiasts to pick up a copy of Safety Afloat, take a few minutes of your time and read it. From this I am sure your boating time will be long, more pleasant, and by far friendlier.
