

President's Message 2011

Here we are ~ May long weekend one year later. Where does time go? I think 2010 was a very successful year for the H.L.C.A. We had a good turnout for the 2010 AGM with informative speakers, introductions and speeches from our local candidates for the Fall election, positive information for the members and a most enjoyable Meet Your Neighbour. A great start to the summer of 2010.

The 2011 AGM and Meet Your Neighbour event will be held on Saturday,

May 21, 2011 at the H.L.C.A. Church/Hall. The AGM begins at 7:00 PM with the Meet Your Neighbour following. This is the opportunity for you to come out and meet your local councilor, Walt McKechnie, listen to guest speakers of interest and visit with the other cottagers and residents of Haliburton Lake. We hope you will join us for the AGM so we can hear what you would like to see happen around the lake and this is your opportunity to voice your concerns. Hopefully this will be a great start to 2011!

We are already in better shape as far as the lake water levels go. It was a desperate situation for everyone last year with the extremely low water levels. This also caused great difficulty and dangerous situations in getting the markers/buoys in place by the HLCA volunteers for navigation. This year we have received some reports of unfortunate incidents with the ice, higher water levels and some docks and cribs around Haliburton Lake. When possible we notified the cottage owners about the situations. We have also notified some members, when incidents were reported to the HLCA, of trees that have come down in the winter months on cottages or buildings. This is another good reason to join the HLCA, as we have the proper contact information if needed when a neighbour or member the lake community informs us of these situations. It was a busy winter on Haliburton Lake with good snow and ice. There appeared to be a lot of ice fisherman and snowmobilers taking advantage of the good local conditions.

Check out the HLCA calendar and the activities and events planned for the summer. With some adjustments all programs will continue for summer 2011, but we are actively looking for volunteers to run the Rock Bass Derby and Adult Bingo. The Rock Bass Derby is an important project to protect the natural reproducing lake trout population of Haliburton Lake. In lake health terms a naturally reproducing lake trout population is like gold! This is also something that many of us learned last year at the meeting, that the water levels in the fall are directly related to the spawning of the lake trout. The water must be at a certain level to provide proper spawning beds. If the water levels rise after, then the eggs will be destroyed, wiping out that year's trout population.





Boating Update



As of September 1, 2009 all persons who drive motorized watercrafts **must** have a valid Boat Licence. The fine is \$250.00 for driving a motorized watercraft of any size without a licence.

The Ministry of Oceans and Fisheries have set new criteria for Boat tests to make them standardized. Tests are now 50 questions long. There will not be any changes for people who now hold a Boat License.

People who still need to get their Boat License can do so with Boat Smart either on-line or at a participating Canadian Tire store. There are also opportunities in Haliburton, check the local papers for dates, locations and times.

In this level the toddler will develops swimming skills such as gliding, floating, and building awareness of deep water and safe entries.









be running Adult Bingo - Thursday Nights at the Hall.


The Adult Bingo program will be changed and condensed from previous years. Unless support is found for this program it will not be continued the following year. Come out and join us. See you at the Hall!



BURNING REGULATIONS

The following are the Dysart et al Burning Regulations and are in effect from April 1 to October 31.

- 1. No burning between two (2) hours after sunrise and two (2) hours before sunset.
- 2. Fires must be attended at all times.
- 3. Person in charge must be competent.
- 4. Must have adequate equipment to extinguish fire.
- 5. Person is responsible for any damages.
- 6. Pile not to exceed two (2) meters high.
- 7. Fires must be away from combustible materials by at least three (3) meters.


I think for many on Haliburton Lake fireworks night is the favourite! We look forward to this event every year as the kick off to summer.



Haliburton Lake Landfill

There is now a 'dumping' bin on site, as well as the recycling bins. Garbage bags are no longer thrown in a pile. There is a dump site manager that will help you if you have questions on where to put your garbage and recycling material. If you have questions or concerns, please contact the Haliburton Landfill Office, ask for Mark, 705 457-9318.

Landfill cards must be shown at the dump when taking garbage. Two landfill cards are inserted with the 2011 Final Tax Bill. Please note: the cards come from the Municipality, the HLCA does not deliver dump cards. If you misplace yours, two free replacement cards can be issued. Please contact the Municipal Office: 705 457-1740. Additional cards if required can be purchased for \$25.00 per card. Please note: The Landowner is responsible for providing the tenants or renters with the landfill cards.

Clear/transparent garbage bags became mandatory as of September 1st, 2007. Only clear or transparent bags are allowed. Up to 1/3 of the garbage in the transparent bag can be placed in a 'kitchen catcher' bag or grocery bag for 'personal items of garbage.

The Mandatory Recycling Program is being strictly enforced. There are recycling bins available for purchase at the Municipal Office and Landfill sites for \$5.00.

There will be a Household Hazardous Waste Day at the Haliburton Landfill Site— Industrial Park in August. Watch the local paper for the announcement.

West Bay Dump hours are: Thursday, 10 AM - 5 PM; Sunday, 12 noon - 8 PM Holiday Mondays: 12 noon - 8 PM

South Bay Dump hours are: Tuesday & Saturday, 10 - 5 PM

Only Household garbage is accepted. No mattresses, sofas, stuffed chairs. No building materials will be accepted. This refuse must go to the Haliburton Landfill site in Industrial Park.

<u>Please</u>, if you do not make it to the dump in time, do not put your garbage at the gate. It <u>will</u> be everywhere the next morning. People live and cottage here. We do not want garbage all over our roads and we do not want to have animals on the road in danger of being hit. Thank you.

After record low water levels in 2010, many cottagers will arrive to record high water levels and many damaged docks, gangways and cribs in 2011.

Unfortunately the low levels of 2010 made placement of the buoys very difficult, dangerous and late. Hopefully 2011 will allow for easier and earlier installation with the HLCA pontoon boat.

At our meetings we receive complaints from cottagers and residents regarding large wakes from boats travelling at a higher rate of speed. 




