We hope that this note finds everyone healthy and safe. For those that do not get to experience the lake in all it's winter bliss, it has been a cold winter on Haliburton Lake. Lot's of minus 20 degree days and more than a handful of minus 30 degree mornings. It is time to take a look at the HLCA's past year and to look forward to getting back to the lake and outdoor activities with friends and family.

The summer of 2021 saw the HLCA have the ability to start offering our legacy programming while taking covid restrictions into consideration. June saw the HLCA hold its AGM virtually again. Our guests included the mayor of Dysart et al Andrea Roberts whom answered questions from the membership and provided an update on Short Term Rental Licenses as well as an update on the proposed Shoreline By Law. Both of these matters are still being dealt with at the county level. Local Councillor Walt McKechnie provided an update on road resurfacing for the summer of 2021. The Haliburton Lake community saw the resurfacing of Haliburton Lake Road from Fort Irwin to Curry Road North. Resurfacing of Dunn Drive was also completed with extra effort from Walt. The installation of speed limit signs was completed by July for the roads surrounding Haliburton Lake. Looking forward, there will be a municipal election in the fall of 2022, the voting for this election will be electronic. Information will be sent prior to the vote.

The AGM also had an introductory presentation from Lisa Severnson and Marco Smits whom represent EORN regarding the GIG Project and the Cell Gap Project. The Cell tower project is currently under way with completion slated for 2025. Rogers Communications, the service providers, made a presentation to the county of Haliburton in the fall of 2021 and two sites had been presented for prospective tower locations on Haliburton Lake. Based on discussions regarding these sites, the site representatives for Rogers Communications have put the Haliburton Lake tower on hold while they consider other locations surrounding the lake.

Board elections were held, Brent McLean (President), Serena Bradbury (Secretary), Brady Siersma (Treasurer) were elected to a two year term in these roles. The Directors of the HLCA agreeing to remain on the board are Nick Mezapelli (Web Master), Kathleen Boss (Communications), Candice Bradbury-Endicott (Membership), Larry Marion and Connor Blackwell. Leaving the board was Owen Blackwell, thank you for your years of service. New to the board is Jay Kea, whom has helped the HLCA for many years with Bingo and the Fishing Derby, thanks for joining. Without these people programming, information and representation provided to the membership would not be possible. The AGM is currently scheduled for Saturday May 21st.

July saw the majority of the programming return in a variety of Covid friendly forms. Swimming lessons resumed in a socially distanced manner, with 130 participants. I would like to thank Erin Metcalf as she is stepping down as the lead volunteer for the swim program. A role she has maintained for many years. Bingo returned in many forms, thanks to the ingenuity of the Kea family. Julia and Ali had the opportunity to call two bingo sessions per week, some being outside, prior to covid limits allowing bingo to occur back in the hall. Sunday's continued to see lots of results at the Rock Bass Fishing Derby. Mid July saw the Scavenger Hunt return for the second socially distanced year, to another resounding success. This event is becoming a highlight of the summer with lots of great feedback and an expanding number of items to locate. Thank you to the organizing volunteers Sue Harrison, Carrie Di Francesco, Ev Fenwick and Lynn Yake.

Once again, August long weekend saw the cancellation of the Regatta due to covid restrictions. In it's place Serena Bradbury and her team of volunteer's pivoted and held a Christmas in July celebration for the kids. This new event included sno cones, cookie and ornament decoration as well as pictures with Santa. The HLCA hopes to continue this event on the July long weekend. Later that evening the Fireworks team found the only half hour window that did not include rain to make good on the earlier call to go ahead with the show. What a SHOW! This event continues to be the highlight of the summer, it has the largest attendance and attracts significant donations. Thank you to Brendan McLennan, Rob Newton, Dan Bycock and Rick Lee, for all of the effort during the year but also the 10 hour day you have putting on the show. Hopefully things get back on track, this year's Canada Fireworks is scheduled for July 2nd.

Lake Navigation and Lake Health continue to be important mandates for the HLCA. The summer of 2021 saw the changing of the hazard markers to a more compliant marker which is also easier to handle. The board has given Bob Bevan the go ahead to replace the Red/Green markers for the summer of 2022. The board is also extremely grateful for the effort that Bob puts into navigation each year. September saw ULinks complete bio metrics testing for lake quality, arranged by Lindsay Bevan. Lindsay is arranging additional testing programs so that the HLCA can create a statistical data bank with respect to the water quality of our lake.

The board is currently planning our legacy events for the summer of 2022. We hope to have all of the events return this summer in their traditional format. While continuing to build on Christmas in July, the Scavenger Hunt and hopefully the return of the Corn Roast with a live band.

1. Head and Assistant Swim Instructor

Qualifications required, at a minimum, are a current Instructors Certificate through the Lifesaving Society and a National Lifeguard Society Certificate. Applicants should be energetic, creative and passionate about children. The ideal Head position candidate will be a great leader, work well as a team and require minimal supervision. The ideal Assistant position candidate needs to be dependable, take direction well and possess a willingness to learn. The salary range for these positions start at \$13 to \$20 per hour depending on qualifications and experience.

2. Swim Program Assistant

We are looking for teen cottagers, with an interest in a future Swim Instructor position, wanting to help our swimming program run smoothly. Interested applicants should be a min. of 13 years old, have a Bronze Medallion certification or higher, have experience with children, and are willing to take initiative and direction. There will be an honorarium offered of \$50.00 per week or we can confirm participation for high school volunteer hour requirements.

*A minimum two week commitment is required.

Responsibilities may include:

- Helping to set up for lessons in the am (i.e., putting out signage, getting equipment set out)
- Cleaning up and maintaining the beach and adjoining park area (i.e., removing geese feces, raking)
- Assisting during the lessons in the water (i.e., helping to engage younger swimmers in games)
- Instructors may also delegate other tasks as needed
